At the Farm	Learning Objective	Activity	Success Criteria
Session 1	To explore what farms are and why they are important.	Find out what a farm actually is before looking at some of the different types of farms, namely arable, livestock and dairy. Explore what happens on each type of farm and consider why farms are so important.	I know what a farm is I understand that different types of farms are used for different purposes I can explain why farms are important
Session 2	To explore the features of a farm.	Identify why farms are found in rural as opposed to urban areas. Identify some of the main buildings in a farm, such as the pig sty, hen house and office, and think about how the land around the farm is used for pasture and crops. Use appropriate vocabulary to discuss each feature, identifying what each is used for.	I know that farms are in rural as opposed to urban areas I can identify some of the features of farms I can match the features of a farm to their functions
Session 3	To be able to use a map and symbols to navigate around a farm.	Recap and identify what the four points on a compass mean and learn how to use them to navigate around a map of a farm. Describe where places are in relation to each other and find out how keys and symbols are used on maps to make them easier to read. Construct own farm map.	I know the four compass points I can use compass points and appropriate locational language to navigate around a map I can use symbols in a map
Session 4	To explore how the seasons affect life on a farm.	Identify the four seasons of the year and identify their features. Explore and describe what typically happens on a farm during each of the four season in terms of animal and crop care.	I know what the four seasons of the year are I can describe what happens on a farm during each of the seasons I can children identify differences in weather patterns throughout the year
Session 5	To explore the differences between life on a farm and life in a town.	Identify the difference between urban and rural areas. Use what has been found out to describe what a farm is like to a city dweller before thinking about ways in which towns and farms are different to each other in terms of both their human and physical feature	I can describe differences between urban and rural areas I can identify geographical features typical to towns and farms I can children identify ways in which towns and farms are different
