Outdoor learning offers learners the opportunity to take supported risks appropriate to the environment and to themselves.



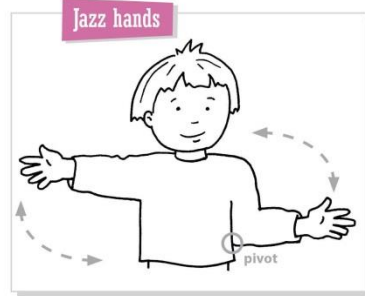
Outdoor learning aims to promote the holistic development of all those involved, fostering resilient, confident, independent and creative learners.



Forest School takes place in a woodland or natural wooded environment to support the development of a relationship between the learner and the natural world.

Development of gross and fine motor skills in Nursery to introduce handwriting and provide a strong foundation for writing. These are carried on into Reception alongside phonics, Literacy and letter formation.

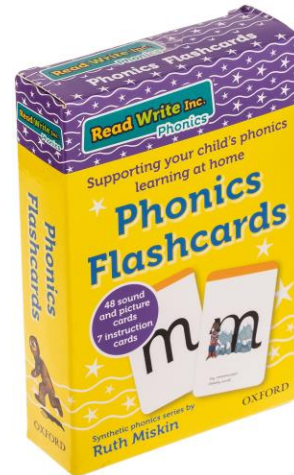

School meals and Packed lunches

School meals cost £2.26 whilst your child is in Nursery or they are free of charge for Reception pupils through Universal Free School Meals. We now have the option where parents can prebook meals through your child's ParentPay account. If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals please apply online or ask for a form at the school office.



School uniform

Cardigans, sweatshirts and polo shirts are available to purchase from the school office payable through ParentPay. They may also be purchased online through Hogarth Uniform, with delivery available free of charge to school or your home address for a small charge. Additional items can be purchased from shops and supermarkets.

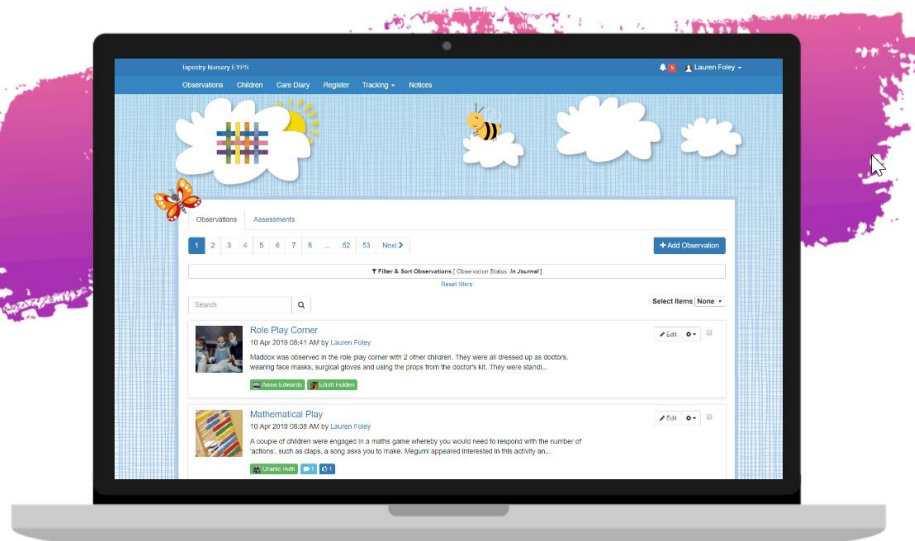
